Subject: Portable Signs - Political Signs

Eliza and Holly – just an FYI....

Ken Sapp came in this morning and asked John Pitsstick about the sign regulations for political messages on portable signs. He wants to hire American Portable Signs to put up four portable signs around the City, opposing the senior tax freeze.

Portable signs require permits, but political signs do not, so I checked with Dave P. and Dave G. (and John also checked with Patricia) and in case either of you get a call from American Portable Signs I wanted you to know that American Portable Signs will not need to get permits for these four signs. Additional restrictions – which have been passed along to Ken and American Portable Signs – the “effective area” must be 36 square feet or less, no more than 8 ft. in height, not illuminated, and have no moving elements. The signs are allowed for a period of 30 days prior to a local election and must be removed no later than seven days after the election. Small political signs are allowed in the right of way, but these portable signs are large enough to where they cannot extend into the public right of way.

I’ve asked Ken to let us know where the signs will be located so that we can pass that information along to Code Enforcement.
